3. Crown Estate's Role

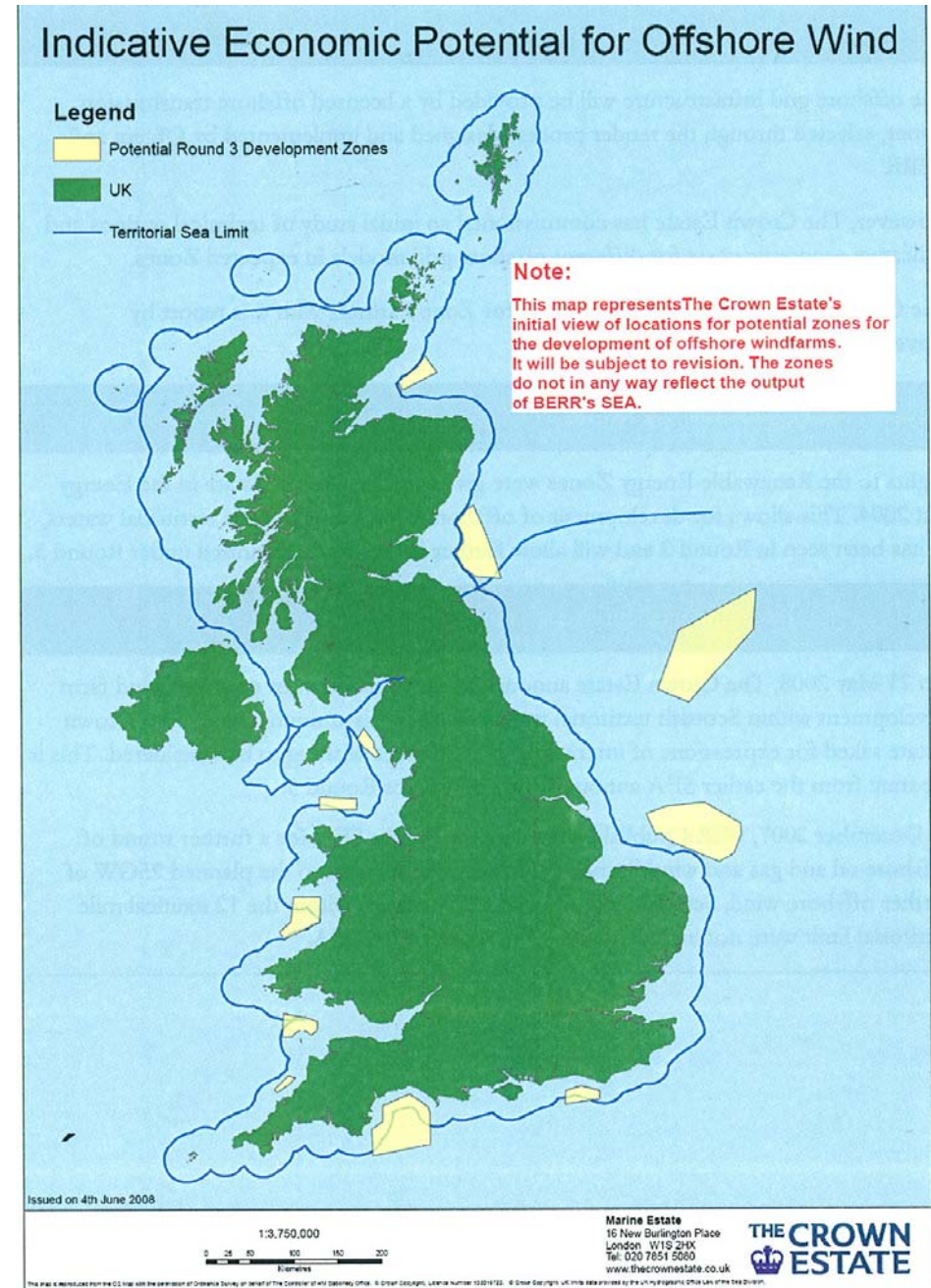
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Development Zones

Potential areas for development

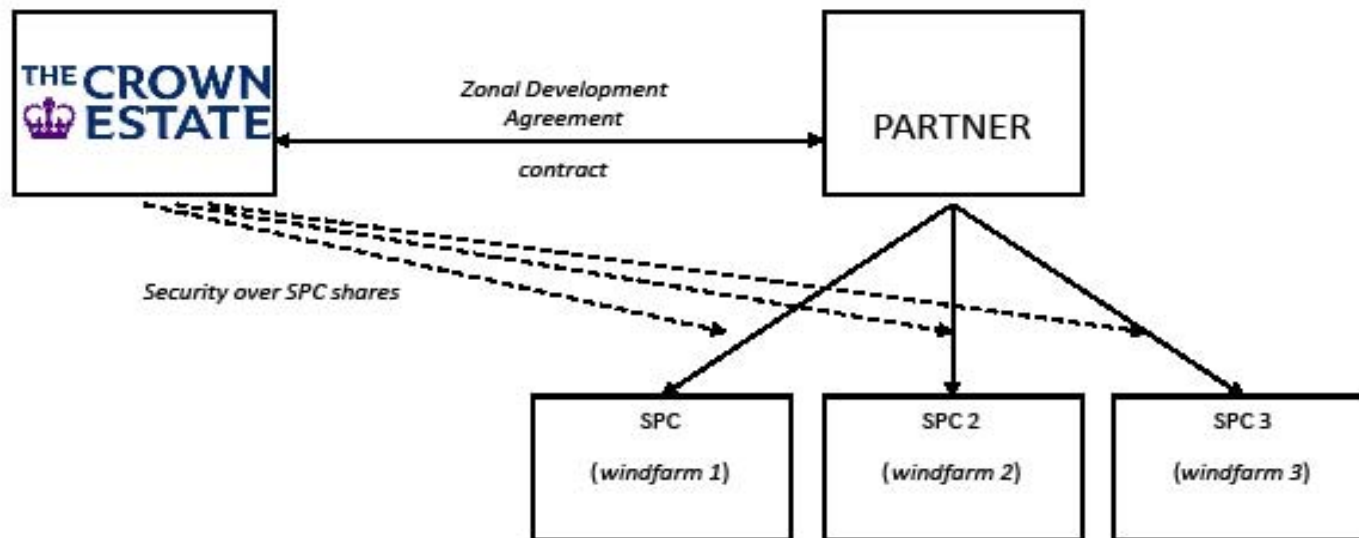
- Zones are indicative

Crown Estate's Role

- **The Crown Estate to fund up to 50% of Round 3 development costs through coinvestment**
- **The Crown Estate to provide a facilitating role**
- **Partner companies to provide full development capability and resources**
- **Relationship between The Crown Estate and development partners will be through contract**

- The Crown Estate Workshops are set for 22nd and 30th July. Expressions of Interest need to be submitted in August. Do consortia need to be formed by the end of August?**
No, individual companies can register.

2. Will potential Partners be permitted to attend both workshops and is there a maximum number of representatives that may attend (CE has indicated that places will be limited).

The content of the Edinburgh and London sessions will be the same but if people want to attend both they are free to do so. We ask that a maximum of 2 persons attend as we have limited space.

- Will legal and technical representatives be permitted to attend?

Anyone who has an interest in participating in the Round 3 programme is welcome to attend.

5. What details are required for submitting expressions of interest? Do we need to focus on geographical areas or is that part of the submission in Q1 2009?

We will be asking for details of company name, address, registration number and contact details for a named individual for all further communication from The Crown Estate with regard to Round 3.

6. Will the English & Welsh EOIs require the same information as the Scottish EOI?

By English and Welsh EOIs, I take it to mean the Round 3 EOI, which includes Scottish REZs, as compared to the EOI for Scottish Territorial Waters, in which case the Round 3 EOI will be on a similar basis.

7. Please could CE advise members of likely tender fees and/or costs? In addition, will Zone Partners be required to provide any bonds, guarantees or other security during the tender process or at any time after the award of development rights in respect to a Zone?

We will not be charging a fee for the tender. Security guarantees will be required for development rights and operational leases

8. Will members get an idea of what the selection criteria look like on receipt of an ITN or will there be any prior information that published by CE in this regards?

The selection criteria will be available at the ITN if not before.
